## Zonal Champions! 5 teams to go to National Finals in Belfast following successful competition at Zonals





On 20<sup>th</sup> January the RPS trampoline squad took 5 teams and individuals to Chesterfield to represent the East Region in the Schools Zonal competition. Due to the early start we arrived the night before which gave us time to eat together and then settle into rooms preparing ourselves for the big day ahead.

We arrived at the competition bright and early for an 8:30am start. The competition spread across the day and lasted until 5pm; within that time we had many successes.

In the Under 13 boys we had 2 gymnasts. Due to snow at regionals they were unable to make a team, however it was a massive achievement for Ellis and Hardy to get through to zonals. Ellis had an amazing outcome, placing 2<sup>nd</sup>, meaning he is going to National Finals in March. Hardy had a great performance, however did not make it through.

The Under 13 girls team, Amy, Olivia, Ellen and Tia all gave great performances and were crowned Zonal Champions coming 1st as a team and they too will compete at the National Finals - well done girls! The under 15 girls team of Ellie, Bronwen, Katie and Milly also came 1st as a team and were Zonal Champions with Ellie getting the highest score in the whole squad. All the girls really deserved the excellent results.


After a fantastic performance from the Under 15 boys team, Tom, Noah and Alex also took the top spot in the team competition. Alongside this, Tom came 1<sup>st</sup> and Noah 3<sup>rd</sup> individually meaning that they are not only going through to Nationals as a team but with two individuals within that team. This is a huge achievement for the boys.

In the afternoon after a long wait it was time for the under 19 Novice and Intermediate girls teams to compete. The novice team - Naomi, Claire and Scarlett - performed two rounds of good routines securing them as Zonal Champions and a place in the National finals. As well, Naomi came 1<sup>st</sup> and Claire 2<sup>nd</sup> so they are also going to Nationals as individuals. The Under 19 girls intermediate team - Izzy, Sarah, Ellie and Lucy - performed amazing routines and won by a massive 20 points to become Zonal Champions with Izzy coming 1<sup>st</sup> and Sarah 2<sup>nd</sup> individually. This is a fantastic achievement as it means they have all made it to Nationals in March in Belfast.

Overall the RPS trampoline squad had the most successful Zonals ever, with all 5 teams crowned Zonal Champions with many individuals going to National Finals which is being held in Northern Ireland for the first time in 30 years. 



#### Alumni of the Month: The Brothers Mackney

#### SPOTLIGHT

In this edition, we talk to ex-RPS student Holly Smith who works as a Psychiatric Nurse about what has happened since choosing Drama at A level.

At that point in my life, I was considering my options in terms of University - I'd always known I wanted to go to University but was unsure of the course I wanted to take and where that would lead me in the future. I based my A Level decisions on what I enjoyed doing and therefore would be willing to truly commit to and work hard for.

In my drama lessons, I gained confidence, compassion, empathy, an ability to put myself in someone else shoes — but I also gained some true friends which I still have now. Studying drama is a real rollercoaster, you become so dependent on the people you are performing and working with that you really go through every emotion under the sun with one another. You bicker and nag at each other as the performance draws closer and the nerves start to show, but that feeling of coming together on the night and putting on your best performance is something unforgettable!

I think the personal challenges with taking drama at A level are the ones I mentioned before – stress manifests itself differently in different people and when you're dependant on your group to turn up to rehearsals, engage, be present and contribute, that can become difficult. It teaches you to manage your own expectations, of both yourself and of others as well as some management skills and when to take a step back for the sake of your own sanity!

At 18 I went to Bath Spa to study Drama and Creative Writing but after a year I left. The course wasn't for me and wasn't what I had hoped it would be and rather than stick it out because I enjoyed the lifestyle and the friendships I made, I left and got a full time job before returning to university in 2015.

In 2015 I returned to University to study Mental Health. I strongly believe there is a direct link between my A Level Drama course and my decision to study Mental Health. Firstly, a lot of the plays we either chose to study or were required to study touched on mental health either as an exploration of the topic or looking at the 'taboo' of mental health. It was during a play my peers and I devised ourselves that I realised I had a really interest in Mental Health and a thirst to learn more and understand more about the topic. Drama has also given me a high level of empathy. Having to walk in someone else's shoes, even if just as a character, gives you the chance to consider how you would feel if you were in that situation and how you would want others to respond.

Currently, I work as a Psychiatric Nurse for a team called C – CATT which is a crisis team for young people with mental health issues. It's hard because the trust is struggling with an overwhelming amount of referrals and a severe lack of staff. But I love my job... you know when you just find your 'thing' – this is my thing!

I think drama has given me to confidence to speak to people from any walks of life which is vital in my line of work. Mental health has no prejudices, it can affect ANYONE. I need to be able to engage both the young person and their families/carers quickly and appropriately in order to get the best and fastest outcome for that young person.

Outside of work – drama gave me some of my best friends! I've mentioned before what drama taught me about compassion, understanding and tolerance of differences. But it also taught me who I could rely on, who would be there to make me laugh when things got difficult! I am lucky to still have amazing friends from my A Level drama class and I wouldn't change that for the world.

My advice to anyone choosing options would be to do what makes you happy! If you love something, you will naturally want to give it your all. 17/18 is too young to be worrying about where you're going to be in 10 years time. There is always an opportunity to change or go back or do things again! But life is too short to be doing things that make you unhappy because that's what your parents want, or your school wants, or what you think you're supposed to do! Do what you enjoy and love every second of it!



## "We're all in this together" Speech, language and communication for children with Down syndrome in the Primary Phase

For staff working in all schools, including Teaching Assistants, Classroom Teachers, SENCO's, Support Teachers, Speech and Language Therapists and parents.

Led by: Leela Baksi, specialist speech and language therapist, Symbol UK Ltd

A one day workshop for families and professionals supporting children with Down syndrome up to the age of 11, on understanding our children's communication profile and supporting them to develop their speech, language and communication skills. This day shares details of the profile of communication strengths and needs associated with DS, and recommended strategies to overcome difficulties and develop skills. We discuss setting up an individually tailored, supportive communication environment, and addressing specific aspects of speech, language and communication skills in everyday life and curriculum activities. It also provides an overview of approaches for speech and language therapy staff who are not familiar with recommendations regarding speech and language therapy for children who have Down syndrome.
