Artificial Pitch - Footwear

The artificial pitch is now available for students to use, provided they have the correct footwear, as per the below guidelines below:

PERMITTED

Studded boots:

where studs screw in. Studs are round or near round.



Moulded boots:

where studs are fixed to the bottom of the boot. Studs are round or near round.



Astro-turf boots (with pimple bottoms):

while these were originally designed for use on sand based astro-turfs – they can be worn on 3G...although they are not as good as moulded /studded boots as they provide less grip.



NOT PERMITTED

Bladed boots: *These are associated with knee ligament injuries and damage to the fibres of the surface when players are turning.*



Flat soled trainers/shoes (tennis shoe, running trainer, plimsol type): *These flatten the fibres down and compact the rubber crumb which results in additional maintenance work being required. Flat soled shoes also provide no grip on this type of surface.*



NOTE

**HYBRID style (stud/blade boots)

We will operate a common sense approach on these style of boots. Where the majority of the boot is studded, we would permit use, but would encourage students to move towards fully studded options with future boot purchases.





Spectroscopy in a Suitcase

On Monday 4th June, the Year 12 chemistry classes were lucky enough to spend time with two chemistry students from UCL. They brought with them an infrared spectrometer (a machine used to identify different organic molecules), which we were allowed to use to test some sample compounds. We could then use our own infrared spectroscopy graph to compare to the ones produced in laboratories, to see whether our graphs showed similarities. In most cases there seemed to be a reasonable resemblance!

We then combined skills that we had previously learnt from other aspects of the AS course to identify more organic substances. We used infrared spectroscopy graphs, mass spectroscopy graphs as well as GCSE knowledge to analyse these substances, and then deduced the displayed formula of the molecule. At times this was challenging, however we worked in small groups, so we all contributed to the discussion, and came up with a final answer.

This session was really interesting and enjoyable, therefore we would like to thank Mrs Corrie and the other chemistry teachers for organising this event.

This year, following a hugely successful senior championships, where great points were earned towards the overall prize, RPS have once again WON the Overall District Championships.


