


## Mandela Charity Week 2018

The week was a great success, raising £1750 (and counting!). To raise awareness for our charities we did 3 things:



# Expressive Arts



## SPOTLIGHT

In this week's edition of RoundUp, we talk to Claire Hysom about her life since taking textiles and photography at A level.

'I took Textiles, Photography, and Product Design at A level and ICT at AS level with an aim of doing a degree in either in Textiles or Product Design. I was also open to the idea of taking an apprenticeship in Photography.

I feel that the design-based and practical skills are what I enjoyed and excelled in most at school. I wanted an education (and a future career) that I enjoyed and was good at, so it made sense to choose practical subjects.

In A level Textiles I learned to love fabrics and the techniques used to make and manipulate them. In A level Photography I developed my photography skills, which I have used consistently for my textiles degree and in the creative business that I have worked for. This includes having my photographs published in a book, on a company's website and helping directly with a photo-shoot for a new collection.

The main challenge for me doing creative A levels was being exact, I'm not a perfectionist by nature but these qualifications helped me to consider detail more closely.

I went on to study Textiles Innovation and Design at Loughborough University. I loved my Degree. Loughborough has been named the best course for Textiles Design in recent years by the Guardian University League Tables and I know I would not have been able to attend this course without each of my creative A levels. More often than not, Loughborough prefers students who have taken a foundation course. I was accepted on the course without a foundation year, in particular because I had three creative A levels, which was similar to a foundation course in the amount of work I produced and the design skills I had developed.

I currently work as a Technical Weave Tutor at De Montfort University. The Job is brilliant. I love teaching students and helping solve any issues they have. My degree was directly related to me getting the job at Loughborough as I had just graduated when they contacted me, asking if I would be willing to work for them.

Outside of work my A levels and degree helped me to develop life skills, like writing formally; problem solving; DIY etc. I am constantly surprised by people who can't use a drill or can't take in a pair of jeans, which are both skills useful in everyday life! Practical subjects develop practical skills, which saves a lot of money and time if you can do jobs like hanging curtains yourself.

Creative subjects such as Textiles, Product Design and Photography have provided me with a whole host of career options. I have interned at five different creative businesses and could name at least twenty more who regularly take interns. There are job options in fashion, interiors, buying, marketing, design, studio work, graphics, product design, artist in residence, education and so many other fields, that I have never felt limited by my degree or my A level choices.

My advice would be to choose the subjects you enjoy and the subjects that will help you get the career you want. I was told by the school that they were concerned I would not keep up with all practical subjects as it was a lot of work, but I managed because I loved what I was doing and it was worth it to get onto the university course I wanted.'

# Eating Disorders in Children and Teens— a Parent's Guide - Talk

## Summary



Eating Disorders often appear in the media and have touched many personally. At one extreme they are trivialised as vanity or a lifestyle choice, and at the other cause alarm due to high profile deaths. Effective psychological treatments are available and the majority of young people recover if they get high quality care early enough. Dr. Nicholls will describe the characteristics of eating disorders, as well as outlining disturbances of eating behaviour that would not be classified as eating disorders. Once established, eating disorders can have a profound effect on young people and on their families. This talk will focus on the early signs of eating disorders, risks for developing eating disorders, and how parents can help if they recognise these difficulties in their child. Dr Nicholls will touch on the latest research about what makes one child vulnerable to developing an eating disorder when another child from the same family and in the same environment may not. The sorts of treatment that a young person should expect will also be outlined, along with pointers to useful sources of support.

## Who is this event for?

This talk is primarily for parents of children age eight and above who are interested in increasing their awareness of this issue. It will also be of interest to all those who work with children and adolescents. The talk will not cover other types of eating difficulties such as fussy or picky eating.

## What parents will gain from the event:

- An understanding of the types of eating disorder and knowledge of how they differ from 'normal' concern about eating, weight and shape
- Recognition of the early signs of disordered eating behaviour and how to respond
- An understanding of some of the factors that may keep an eating disorder going once it has developed
- Knowledge about the types of effective psychological treatment that are available
- Knowledge of who to contact and where to turn if you need more help

Dr Dasha Nicholls is a Reader in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at Imperial College London and works as a Consultant Child and Adolescent Eating Disorders Psychiatrist in London and Bedfordshire. Previously she co-led the Feeding and Eating Disorders service (FEDS) at Great Ormond Street Hospital. Her clinical work is concerned with feeding and eating disorders in children and adolescents, including early onset eating disorders, avoidant restrictive food intake disorders, and child and adolescent obesity. She has published over 60 research articles and book chapters and is actively engaged in lecturing and teaching. She is Past President of the Academy of Eating Disorders, was Chair of the Junior MARSIPAN group, is a member of the NICE Guideline Committee and Expert Reference Group, and is chair of the Eating Disorders Faculty of the Royal College of Psychiatrists.
