## Headlines

Dear Parents and Carers

A month into the term we are happy to say that the school is running, lessons are happening and staff are still smiling (just about!). The early teething problems with meals, breaktimes and lunchtimes have largely been ironed out, although we do understand that this is still not an optimal service. Similarly, we have improved the study space for the Sixth Form, giving both year groups access to the Common Room.

The two cases of COVID-19 that Roundwood has had so far have presented us with opportunities to further enhance our online provision. The Year 7 form which had to self-isolate took part in two days of lessons with live content in each of them and a questionnaire has allowed us to learn more about how we can improve. Although it is our aspiration to offer significant live teaching to all students who are self-isolating and are feeling well, this is not always possible currently. Rest assured that we are working towards providing this as soon as possible and in the meantime constantly improving our live capability. It is in order to improve this capability that we are closing early next Wednesday afternoon, with two further early closures planned for the second half of the autumn term. I continue to liaise with my fellow Headteachers in Harpenden and know that the provision in this regard is similar across the town.

If you have not yet had a chance to see our virtual Open Evening please do check it out via the link below and I would be grateful if you shared it with any prospective parents who are thinking of sending their child to Roundwood Park. We have spent a lot of time working on these materials despite the other time pressures we are facing at the moment. Congratulations to all of the staff and students who contributed to them.

## Early School Closure on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> October

Please may we remind you that school will close early next Wednesday, as follows:

**Years 7, 8 and 9** will have lunch in school and will go to the beginning of their period 4 lesson at 1.05pm to be registered by their classroom teacher. Year 7 will leave the school site at 1.10pm, Year 8 will leave at 1.15pm and Year 9 will leave at 1.20pm. Buses will arrive at 1.30pm.

## Keeping students and staff safe


This email address is dedicated to positive results only and will be monitored during school hours, evenings and weekends. This will help us quickly contact the necessary Public Health officials and communicate and advise those families or staff members concerned, keeping everyone safe and helping to prevent the spread of the virus.

We urge you to continue to take a cautious approach, should your child/ren start to show symptoms that could be Covid-19 or a cold, rather than sending them into school. We believe by taking a cautious approach we have a much better chance of keeping the school open to as many students as possible, so that when your child is better the school is open for them to return to.

The flow chart below may help you to navigate the difficult decision of whether to book a Covid-19 test, see a doctor, cautiously keep your child at home to monitor their symptoms closely or send them to school.

# PUZZLE OF THE WEEK


**Roundwood Park has registered to take part in a free, international puzzle competition called Puzzle of the Week.**

## Competitive University Students

The next group of aspiring and ambitious Year 12 students looking to apply for courses in Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Science, or with a vision to apply to Oxford or Cambridge have been challenged to stretch their experiences beyond the curriculum. At a seminar after school on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> September, students were reminded of super curricula activities they could be doing to enhance their learning experiences beyond the curriculum. Students gaining offers and places on competitive courses in 2020 built their academic profiles throughout their time in Sixth Form, through wider reading, visiting exhibitions (many are now online), attending online course days at universities (also available online) and attending university free public lectures (again available remotely), in a bid to stretch and enhance their learning experiences and to delve deeper into the subjects they enjoy. We would love parents' support – even at 17 years, students need encouragement to reflect on the experiences they have, challenge and question how they think about topics, and practice talking about new ideas and insights. Oxplora is a fantastic website, developed by the University of Oxford – it is designed to encourage students to think big!

### **Using public transport for school transport – duplicate services**

With the need for social distancing on buses, both the council and commercial operators are running duplicate services on busy school routes. These routes are closed routes for students only. Where a school duplicate bus service is provided, it may be operated by a different company and may run up to five minutes earlier than the scheduled service; it is clearly marked as a duplicate / school only service.

Whilst social distancing is required when travelling on local bus services for the general public and students, it is not required on a duplicate service exclusively for students. It is however mandatory for young people to wear a face covering (unless exempt) on the duplicate buses as well as general bus services.



**Birdland Band** (formerly Big Band 2) membership entitles you to online resources plus face to face sessions weekly (Thursday 6.30-7.30), with performance opportunities at selected SAMS events.

This ensemble is aimed at woodwind, brass and rhythm section (guitar, piano, bass & drums) players who are just starting out - we cater for everyone from Grades 1-5. We learn how to read and play in an ensemble, often working without the dots and learning simple jazz tunes by ear. We also take our first steps into improvising and although it is definitely not compulsory it is a great supportive environment to give it a go for the first time!



**Vanguard band** (formerly Big Band 1) membership entitles you to a weekly face-to-face or online session (Thursday 8.00-9.00), multiple performance opportunities and membership of Herts Youth Jazz Ensemble (who perform annually at Herts Jazz Festival) and have a project with NYJO coming up this year.

This ensemble is aimed at sax, brass and rhythm section (Guitar, Piano, Bass, Drums) players who are looking to perform at an advanced level with similar aged people. Players are usually grade 5+. We cover a large amount of repertoire from traditional large ensemble (Big Band) work to smaller more combo based things. We usually feature a Jazz great as a 'composer in residence' each year and cover much of their catalogue. Previously we have focused on the music of Charles Mingus, Monk, Duke Ellington & Count Basie, and in 2020/21 we'll be focusing on bebop architect, Charlie Parker.




