- Spanish can be studied at degree level both as a subject on its own, as part of a joint degree and as a subsidiary subject, combined with a wide range of other subjects, including Politics, Maths, Science, History, English, Marketing & Engineering

- Our main textbook is the new AQA Spanish A Level Textbook published by OUP.
- We subscribe to Kerboodle which provides an electronic textbook and a range of interactive resources for use in class and at home.
- Each pupil is also encouraged to purchase their own textbook and grammar workbook
- Extensive use is made of ICT (including authentic internet sites).
- We are fortunate to have volunteer Spanish assistants in school. Pupils will have one session a week with them. (during Lunchtime or free study periods)
