<p>Read a novel which is based on an artist. eg- Girl with Pearl Earring, Notes from an Exhibition,</p>	<p>Research and make your own paints, pigments or dyes. Create your own egg tempera or other paints. Create your own book of samples.</p>	<p>Look at this website to see what people say about their careers in the arts. <p>Read the 'Eye Witness Guide to Watercolour'. Carry out experiments shown in the book</p>	<p>Research and make your own paints, pigments or dyes. Create your own egg tempera or other paints. Create your own book of samples.</p>	<p>Find a local artist: ask if you can interview them about their work. Produce this in a journalistic way. (You could refer to the Open Studios brochure)</p>
<p>Read information about an exhibition, visit the exhibition and write about it.</p>	<p>Produce a piece of art work in response to an artist or artwork you have seen (preferably seen first hand)</p>	<p>Choose an art form which isn't painting for example sculpture, graphics, animation, architecture, jewellery design, ceramics etc. Find well known artists/designer linked to these and research their work. These could be contemporary people or people from the past.</p>
<p>Read articles in old or current art magazines. Eg: RA magazine, Tate magazine, Artists and Illustrators, Crafts magazine. There are lots of back issues in the art department.</p>	<p>Create a sketchbook called your 'art exhibitions book'. Go to museums or galleries and draw the work or objects you see. Make notes while you are there.</p>	<p>Find out about an art technique and teach it to someone else.</p>
<p>Choose an art style or artist and read about it. Go to the library and talk to the librarian about what you are looking for.</p>	<p>Create a visual diary/sketchbook of things you see, do or places you go to. This work will be continued over a long period of time.</p>	<p>Find out about art from a different culture or country. This could be based on any art, craft or design form.</p>
