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Read 'DNA' by Dennis Kelly - Uploaded on the Google Classroom	Print off the next year's programme of NT live cinema broadcasts and book to see one.	Go onto Google Expeditions and explore the arts and culture section. Search theatre into the search bar and spend 30 minutes exploring.
Conduct your own research on a play that you are currently studying or that is coming up for study.	Get involved in one of the extra-curricular activities in drama this term.	Look into your local theatres. What's on and do they offer anything to young people like work experience or apprenticeships.
Select, borrow and read a play out of the following types from the drama office or library a. a Shakespeare tragedy b. a play written last century c. a play written in the last 20 years.	Visit either the Theatre Museum in Drury Lane or the Theatre Costume floor of the V&A Museum.	Find and watch three Ted-X lectures. One related to Shakespeare, one related to theatre and its place in society over time and one of free choice.
Read this article about Theatre in education as a genre. There's a video to watch on here too. What is TIE?	Create a Minecraft version of a set from a play of your choice or create a 3d model of it.	Find research and statistics about the issues within one of the plays you are currently covering in class.
Go to Frantic's website and explore it, reading about how they create shows and what their method is.	Run a club or rehearsal of your own, either exploring something explored in a lesson or something you are interested in.	Find previous productions of one of your plays and understand the viewpoint of the playwright, a director and a designer who has worked on it.
