<p>Read the Guardian article How to Write a Hit Song. Use these ideas for your own composition.</p>	<p>Teach your family about one of the strands. Perform examples on your instrument.</p>	<p>Find an 80s rock performance online. Review the piece referring to instruments, technology and Harmony.</p>
<p>Read the 'Rhythms of the World' information on GCSE bitesize.</p>	<p>Create your own knowledge organiser on The Music of the Indian Subcontinent.</p>	<p>Find a university course for music and explore the course credentials needed to attend. Can you find any famous alumni?</p>
<p>Read the score of Corelli's Concerto Grosso in F major. Highlight the concertino and ripieno.</p>	<p>Perform a piece from the classical period on your instrument.</p>	<p>Research extended techniques on your instrument. Find a piece of music that requires some of these techniques and take it to your instrumental teacher.</p>
<p>Read the book Film Themes by John Williams.</p>	<p>Go and see one of your favourite film soundtracks being performed live at the Film Music Gala at the Royal Albert Hall.</p>	<p>Find a music group in your community. Join the group and perform in at least two concerts or gigs. Try to push yourself to perform a style of music that you have not performed before.</p>
<p>Read up on your instrument. When did your instrument or equipment become popular? Does your instrument play at Concert Pitch or is it a Transposing</p>	<p>Perform your composition to someone at home</p>	<p>Find someone who needs some music tuition. This could be theory or practical. Give some tutoring to help them either pass a theory grade or help them learn a new piece on an instrument.</p>
