
Course Overview


Year 10 -component 1

A theme is set by the teacher; this year it is 'Nature under the microscope'. We experiment with techniques and media to develop our skills and confidence. We'll look at artists' work to inform your own work.

Out of this work you will develop your own ideas and create personal art work. This could be a painting or other media that you choose.







Year 11

Term 1 Mock Exam Project. Component 1

We give you a title as a starting point for a project. You develop your ideas through preparation, experimentation and research. You will have 2 days to complete a piece of work using your preparatory work.

Term 2 Externally set Assignment. Component 2

The Exam board set the theme for this project. They give suggestions for starting points and artists.

You have several weeks to prepare for the 2 day exam.

Preparation and final piece are then submitted for assessment














Exam theme: The title is a starting point for your ideas.

Assessment for GCSE Art courses

- Coursework (60%) A portfolio of work from year 10 and the mock exam
- Externally set Assignment(40%) The project carried out in term 2 of year 11.
