Course Overview

Component 1: Human Lifespan Development

Learners will learn all about development through different life stages and investigate how, in real situations, human development is affected by different factors and that people deal differently with life events.

Component 2: Health and Social Care Services and Values

Learners study and explore practically, health and social care services and how they meet the needs of real service users. They also develop skills in applying care values.





Learners will study the factors that affect health and wellbeing, learning about physiological and lifestyle indicators, and how to design a health and wellbeing improvement plan.

Internal Assessment

A written assignment tasks, set by the exam board.

<u>Component 1</u>; studying a known individual and discussing their growth and development across life stages and the factors that affect it.

<u>Component 2</u>; looking at provision of health care and the barriers that may affect access and maintenance of health.

External Synoptic Assessment

An exam where students read a range of case studies and answers questions based on their knowledge from all three components.
