Year 12. Introduction to the course

During this time, students develop their understanding of photography and photographers. They develop their experience through short projects on set themes.

During the course you will:

Develop your own ideas on a chosen theme Respond to the work of artists and photographers Experiment with media, techniques and processes Record your work and ideas as it progress in sketchbooks Produce outcomes which show your skills and understanding of visual language



Unit1: Developing Photography Skills Sept to Jan

1.Small sketchbooks documenting Photography techniques and elements

2. Develop skills following a theme set by the teacher for example 'Still life photography'

Unit 2: Understanding how to develop a project Jan - May


A short project with a starting point set by the teacher for example 'portraiture'.

After May students begin preparatory work on the assessed component of the A level the Personal Investigation



Course Overview

Year 13 The work submitted for final assessment is made up of 2 components.



Component 1: Personal Investigation A theme chosen by the student.

60% of A level

- Comprises:
 Sketchbooks showing development
- Experiments
- Reference to artists/photographers
- 1000-3000 word essay
- Final, large scale print/s

Component 2: Externally set assignment Feb 1st to May of Y13

40% of A level


- Students choose a title from list set by exam board.
- Sketchbooks show development of work based on the title
- Reference to artists
- Final, large scale printed image





There are 4 assessment objectives which cover:

- Development of ideas, investigations, critical studies
- Refining work through experiments
- Recording your ideas and insights
- Presenting a meaningful, successful response



Component 1: 60% Personal Investigation. Sketchbook, preparation and final outcome

Component 1: 1000-3000 Word essay for Personal Investigation



Assessment – All in Y13




Component 2: 40% Externally Set Assignment – Sketchbooks, preparation and a final piece produced during a 15 hour exam.
