Key Knowledge	Students begin to understand pulse and rhythm notation through clapping exercises. (Underground Music) Students begin to learn about the background to African Music and the culture. Students learn on the Djembe and perform rhythms of Africa. Students learn about the different roles within the performance and demonstrate instrument techniques.	Students continue their understanding of African music through listening and recognising different African instruments. Students begin to understand cross rhythms and the role of a master drummer through composition. Students compose their own piece in groups and evaluate each other's performances. Students will identify baroque instruments through listening and be able to identify musical features.
