




Head's Up





They had a very busy day with two sessions delivered by outside providers - the fantastic Dr Kathy Weston from Tooled Up Education spoke about managing stress and anxiety; how to be 'brilliant, resilient you!' And our visitor from Herts Young Homeless focussed on the topic of 'Conflict Resolution'. Students also took part in workshops regarding their Emotional Health and the importance of Peer Support, discussing empathy and positive online behaviour.


On the catering app you may see drink purchases banded in order for us to more efficiently use the tills. The bands can be explained as below:


























District Trampette & Tumble Competition

Wind Rush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah: This is the story of Leonard, who at 10 years old makes the journey with his mother from Jamaica to join his father in England. Leonard is part of the Windrush generation, one of thousands of people and families who were persuaded by the government to help rebuild England after the Second World War and make a better life for themselves. It's a book to make children and adults alike think hard about our history, about racism and the Black Lives Matter movement, about fairness, about politics - and about bravery and unsung heroes.


