Yr13 Biology Field Trip

Just before half term our Yr13 biologists enjoyed a weekend of fieldwork in North Yorkshire. They covered a range of our <u>ASPIRE Learning Habits</u> as they conducted their research...

RESPONSIBLE LEARNERS: Our biologists set Longworth traps overnight to investigate the feeding relationships in the North Yorkshire woodland. They constructed their traps, including warm bedding and food for their potential visitors! The next morning the traps were checking, any small mammals were investigated and released back to their habitat. They also set up a wildlife camera to see what visitors frequent the area overnight!

FOCUS: After a long day completing field work, the Year 13 biologists spent the evening examining the invertebrate samples they collected in a Mayfly Nymphology session. They used microscopes and completed scientific drawings to scale using graticules.

COLLABORATION: Our biologists braved the rain and wind to investigate sand dune succession on the North Yorkshire coast. They were finding out how the distribution of species changes as you move further inland.

ORGANISE: They launched into their freshwater ecology session, collecting a range of invertebrates and investigating abiotic factors such as pH, oxygen saturation and turbidity.

They also took the opportunity to have a picnic in the glorious Yorkshire sunshine!

Bold Voices Ambassador Programme

This academic year Roundwood is taking part in the <u>Bold Voices Ambassador</u> <u>Programme</u>. This is an <u>eight</u> month online programme for students and staff to build the knowledge and skills to run projects challenging gender inequality and gender-based violence within their school communities.

As part of this programme Bold Voices is running two parent and carer webinars (30 November 2023 and 7 March 2024) to ensure that parents and carers feel equipped to carry on this conversation at home.

The first webinar, 'Starting the Conversation: Tools for tackling misogyny with teens' is an introduction to the issues of gender inequality, misogyny and gender-based violence our teens are facing and how to bridge the gap and talk about this tricky topic at home.

It is taking place on Thursday 30 November 2023, 6pm-7:30pm and can be booked through the Roundwood Park booking link: <u>HERE</u>



How to get involved?


- Buy a £3 shoebox from the PE office at breaktime from Friday



One School, One Read

Each year, as part of our celebration and promotion of the power of reading, we endeavour to share a story as a community. This year's One School, One Read novel is the powerfully short and incredibly beautiful 'Blue Book of Nebo' by Manon Steffan Ros. It was originally published in Welsh so is a novel in translation.





We feel that it explores many of our school values through the themes of kindness, community and having integrity at all times. We also feel that the protagonist's story is really inspirational. Even though we only released the title just before half term, over 30 of the Roundwood Park community have read the novel already and are proudly wearing their badge and collecting house points along the way.

Be sure to get involved whether you are a student or a parent! Here's the blurb to whet your appetite:

Dulan was six when The End came, back in 2018; when the electricity went off for good, and the 'normal' 21st-century world he knew disappeared. Now he's 14 and he and his mum have survived in their isolated hilltop house above the village of Nebo in north-west Wales, learning new skills, and returning to old ways of living. Despite their close understanding, the relationship between mother and son changes subtly as Dylan must take on adult responsibilities. And they each have their own secrets, which emerge as, in turn, they jot down their thoughts and memories in a notebook - the Blue Book of Nebo.






























Yr12 Artist Jacob V

Visit the gallery's website


Year 12 student Jacob V (Jacob V Jordan) has moved on from exhibitions in Harpenden to showcasing his work in the Zari Gallery in London! At the age of 16, to have a body of work that a London gallery is confident to show and add to the catalogue is absolutely unprecedented.

Jacob is an abstract-expressionist artist living in Harpenden. His work is about "cognitive dissonance" and how this mental conflict between a person's values and behaviours can cause emotional unease. His work focuses on varied subject ideas that he has experienced or become interested in. He abstracts the ideas to give them a personal perspective on the subject. He starts with several layers of acrylic painting the broad and basic structure that he can envisage. Works can take months to create due to the drying time of each layer. Once happy with the overall structure Jacob will impasto with a palette knife thick oil paint to really express areas of interest. He will come back to his work to review and add oil pastels to areas that seem compelling. Jacob enjoys painting on large surfaces and has also worked in ceramics constructing raku firings and using the school kiln. He is inspired by politics, history and events and experience he has lived. Art is a way for him to express how he views the world. Jacob is a very modest young man, but his accomplishment is huge, and the school and our Art department are very proud of Jacob and can't wait to see what comes next for this extremely talented young man.

His exhibition is named 'Beyond Brushstrokes: Evoking Emotion in Dual Mediums' and will be at the gallery until 16 November, go and see it if you can!
