Knowledge Outline for KS3 Spanish

Learning a language allows students to **grow an appreciation of other cultures** whilst developing **key skills for effective communication**. They will know how to manipulate key grammatical structures to create some original communication. They will also know their **phonics in the foreign language** to help build self-efficacy in speaking skills. Students will be able to give **opinions** with convincing justifications as well as discuss **past, present and future events** linked to a variety of topics.
