
In addition, 7 teams qualified - 5 of which go there as Zonal Champions, and the other 2 teams finished in 2nd place.

Young Carer?




Does your child help to look after a member of your family

who has an illness, disability, or who takes drugs or alcohol? If so, your child is a young carer.


A young carer is someone under the age of 19 who does things that would normally be done by an adult. Often, this means they undertake jobs to help a family member meet their daily need, such as cooking meals, going shopping, making sure someone takes their medicine or providing someone with emotional support. We know that looking after a loved one can be hard and that students who are young carers may need extra support in school to enable them to flourish. We are therefore asking families to get in contact with us through admin@roundwoodpark.co.uk if they feel their child meets the criteria above, or who has already been assessed as a young carer, so that we can provide support and advice where needed.
