
#### SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The deadline for entry for consideration submission is Friday 1st March, 2024 and Swimmers selected will be informed by Sunday 3rd March, 2024.



#### Year 10 & 11 Trip to the Opal Coast

Last Friday a sleepy group of Year 10 & 11 students set off for a French adventure. First stop was a Second World War Museum where we learnt about the War from the French perspective. Then on to our accommodation in the countryside, complete with ducks, cats, goats and sheep!

Day two saw us headed to Boulogne-sur-Mer for a market challenge. The students were given a small number of euros and had to buy sandwich fillings which they later used to construct *le sandwich le plus français*. The teachers were very impressed with their bartering in French! That afternoon we went to an artists' workshop and created wonderful things in clay and paper, rounding off the day at a bakery where the *boulanger* shared his passion for his *metier* of breadmaking.

On day three we headed to a Maritime Museum where we learnt to mend nets and heard of the hard life of a fisherman, finishing by tickling rays in the touch tank! The afternoon was spent in Le Touquet, exploring the local shops and then on to the ramparts at Montreuil-sur-Mer for a walk overlooking the French countryside.

On the morning of day four we visited a local school. Our students met French students of a similar age, had tours of the classrooms and swapped ideas in both languages. This experience really boosted their confidence when they realised how much they can say in French!

Enormous thanks go to Mr Seymour, Mrs Phillips, Mrs Brooke and Mrs Capel for caring for our students on the trip, to Ms Manton and the site team for all their help and especially our students, who really did us proud. We received so many compliments about how they conducted themselves and how well they spoke French.
























#### Year 10 Trip to Madrid






# So What is the Bookopoly Challenge?

Students can play it like the game of Monopoly throwing a dice to randomly select a genre or work their way round the board sequentially.





#### **Our New Head Students!**



### **UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge**

On Wednesday 31 January, we had 110 students partake in the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge, testing their mathematical skills and problemsolving. The top scoring 50% of students that partake in the challenge nationally achieve either Bronze, Silver or Gold and we had 80 of the 110 achieve one of these! Furthermore, of all the students across the UK that undertake the challenge, around 8,000 of the very highest performers partake in the follow-on Kangaroo round of which we had 19 students qualify. Even more amazingly, R. Amelines in Yr10 qualified for the follow-on Olympiad round of which only around 1,500 of the very highest performers are invited to. This is an incredible achievement and we're extremely proud of our students. Well done to everyone who took part in the challenge!
