### **Student Safety**





Following the recent Parent Governor Election, we are delighted to announce that **Laura Clark** and **Sonja Stocks** will be joining the RPS Governing Board.



### Year 12 & 13 History/PRE Trip to Rome

Amidst the bustling streets of Rome, a group of eager students embarked on a journey through time, exploring the ancient wonders and cultural treasures of this historic city. Over the course of three days, they delved into the heart of Rome's past, discovering its iconic landmarks and hidden gems.

#### Day 1: The Colosseum, Forum, and Palatine Hill

The journey began with a visit to one of Rome's most renowned landmarks, the Colosseum. Guided by knowledgeable historians, students learned about the significance of the Colosseum in Roman society and its enduring legacy. Next was the Roman Forum, a sprawling complex of ruins that served as the political, religious, and commercial centre of ancient Rome, gaining an insight into life in ancient times.

#### Day 2: Vatican City and the Sistine Chapel

Day two brought the students to the heart of Christianity. Stepping into St. Peter's Square, they were greeted by the towering dome of St. Peter's Basilica, a masterpiece of Renaissance architecture, and inside they marvelled at exquisite works of art, including Michelangelo's Pieta, before ascending to the top of the dome for panoramic views of the city. The highlight of the day, however, lay within the Vatican Museums - the Sistine Chapel. As students entered this sacred space, necks craned upward to take in the breathtaking frescoes adorning the ceiling and walls. Michelangelo's iconic depiction of the Creation of Adam left a lasting impression, sparking discussions about art, religion, and the human spirit.

#### Day 3: Catacombs of San Sebastian and Trevi Fountain

On the final day of their adventure, the students delved into the underground catacombs of San Sebastian, a labyrinth of ancient burial chambers and passageways. Led by our knowledgeable guides, they learned about the early Christians burial site hidden in these subterranean tunnels, their faith unyielding amidst persecution. Emerging into the sunlight, the students made their way to the Trevi Fountain, a dazzling masterpiece of Baroque artistry, and tossed coins into the fountain, following the tradition that promises a return to Rome.

We enjoyed some lovely weather and there was enough spare time that students were able to explore Rome at their own pace, discovering quaint cafes (or Italian McDonalds!) and indulging in several delicious flavours of gelato! Whether we were wandering through picturesque piazzas or soaking in the sights and sounds of the city, each moment was a testament to the beauty and charm of Rome. We hope students left this fantastically unique city with their hearts full of memories and their minds enriched by the wonders of this ancient place.


















### Hello and Goodbye to our SLG!


































## National Careers Week #NCW2024


























### A Level Textiles Lingerie Design Workshop

Our Year 12 and 13 students recently took part in a lingerie design workshop hosted by Laurie Van Jonsson. Laurie works in contour fashion, specialising in lingerie design. She has run her own business and also designed lingerie for high street brands Topshop, Next and River Island. Laurie also designed swimwear for an Australian swimwear brand and now runs Van Jonsson Design, a consultancy working and supporting lingerie designers in building their brands, the intricacies of pattern making, garment construction and design.

Laurie created a bespoke 'briefs' workshop for our students and during the session they looked at design trends and then designed, selected specialist fabrics, dealt with pattern cutting and made a final outcome.

Students gained professional insight and a taster for how the fashion industry works and what it is like to make a garment from their own design idea.
