Here are some ideas</p> <p>"Number the Stars" by Lois Lowry Setting: Nazi-occupied Denmark, 1943 Plot: A Danish girl helps her Jewish best friend escape the Nazis.</p> <p>"The Diary of Anne Frank" (Anne Frank: The Diary of a Young Girl) Setting: Amsterdam, Nazi-occupied Netherlands Plot: The real diary of a Jewish girl in hiding.</p> <p>"The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas" by John Boyne Setting: Auschwitz, through the eyes of a Nazi commandant's son Plot: A friendship forms between a German boy and a Jewish boy on opposite sides of a concentration camp fence. Content Warning: Powerful, tragic ending—emotional maturity recommended.</p> <p>"The Book Thief" by Markus Zusak Setting: Nazi Germany Plot: A young girl steals books to share stories during the horrors of WWII, narrated by Death.</p> <p>"Sarah's Key" by Tatiana de Rosnay (Young Adult edition) Setting: Paris, 1942 & modern day Plot: A girl is arrested in the Vel' d'Hiv roundup; years later, a journalist uncovers her story. Content: Sad and haunting—best for mature 13-year-olds.</p> <p>"I Am David" by Anne Holm Setting: Post-WWII Europe Plot: A 12-year-old boy escapes from a concentration camp and journeys across Europe.</p> <p>"Resistance" by Jennifer A. Nielsen Setting: Nazi-occupied Poland Plot: A Jewish girl joins the resistance and smuggles food, weapons, and people.</p> <p>"Milkweed" by Jerry Spinelli Setting: Warsaw Ghetto, Poland</p>	20pts

	<p>Plot: A young orphan navigates life in the ghetto, not knowing he's Jewish.</p> <p>"Heroes of the Holocaust" (short story collection) Plot: True and fictionalized accounts of real people who risked everything to save others.</p> <p>"The Silver Sword" by Ian Serraillier Setting: War-torn Europe Plot: Three children travel from Poland to Switzerland to reunite with their family.</p>
