Key Knowledge	This unit practically introduces students to the musical elements through singing & instrumental work that involves ostinato patterns. Students perform music as a class & compose ostinato patterns inspired by Danse Macabre for a spooky video.	Students continue learning about the musical elements through programme music. Students write a piece in response to a given poem (Danse Macabre). Students go on to perform a waltz and begin to combine sections as a whole composition. Students describe their work referring to the musical elements.	Students develop their keyboard performance skills. They develop their knowledge and understanding of treble clef notation and focus on a good playing technique. Students are introduced to the background and origins of the blues. Students will learn how to improvise using the blues scale and understand the 12-bar blues chord progression.	Students develop their understanding of electronic music through listening. Pupils will understand the process of sequencing, using samples to create a suitable electronic dance soundtrack of 'Uninvited'.	Pupils will explore the background to Blues music through listening and performing. Students will focus on the blues scale, 12 bar blues chords and walking bass. Students will learn how the blues music was inspired by gospel music.	Students continue to explore the blues through blues songs. Students understand the AAB form and write their own lyrics. Students combine the blues elements they have learnt in a group and write their one song.
