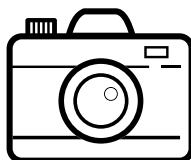
Mr Garbutt has a few words...

Team Maths Competition

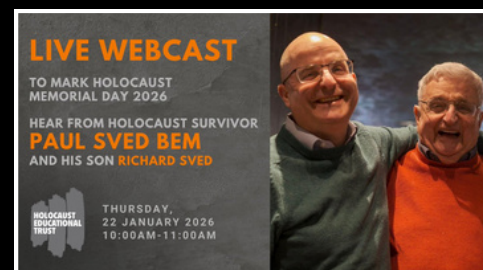

Vape Brain Sculpture

Last week we were delighted to host the 'Vape Brain' sculpture. A work of art designed by 19 year old Milena Melnychenko, and made by her fellow 3D design students from Hertford Regional College in Ware. Made from boxes of seized illegal vapes it is touring schools in Hertfordshire to highlight the impact nicotine dependency has on mental health - and how the flavours and package designs of vapes are aimed at attracting young people.

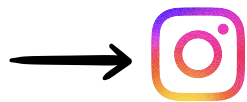
